Harvest Festival

Late September and early October see widespread celebrations of Harvest, even in a nation where most people are disconnected from when, where and how their food is produced. Living in our beautiful valley, we at least see crops and animals in the fields and I hope we do not forget our farming community and their labours. It is amazing how popular harvest festivals are, even in our cities. It is right to affirm our unity with nature and to remember that we are entirely dependent on the harvest from the land and sea.

It is sad to reflect that we still need to collect tinned and dried foods, amongst other things, for food banks in the 21st century, and that that is where harvest festival gifts now often go.

Today many fewer people are directly connected with the land, but in Victorian times whole villages turned their hand to the harvest. It is not surprising that at the end of the harvest, all that people wanted to do was to have a party - the 'Harvest Home', the origin of the harvest supper or lunch. Although many a rural parson may have understood why church attendance plummeted during harvest, they would have lamented the raucous nature of the celebrations.

There is something about the Harvest Festival that evokes a feeling of ancient, even pagan, celebration, so it can come as a surprise to learn that, in its present form, it is a Victorian invention. It was the Revd Robert Hawker, a rather idiosyncratic parson-and-poet, who dreamt up the idea, inspired by the ancient Saxon Lammas - Loaf Mass — celebrated at the beginning of August with bread made from the very first wheat cut from the fields.

On 13th September 1843, he put up a notice which read,

'Let us gather together in the chancel of our church, and there receive, in bread of the new corn, that Blessed Sacrament, which was ordained to strengthen and refresh our souls'.

Eccentric though he may have been, the Revd Hawker, a profoundly spiritual man, is justly remembered for inventing the Harvest Festival.

The month of October ends with Halloween, All Saints and All Souls. Hallowe'en is the Eve of All Hallows, and pre-Christian superstitions, which had endured for centuries, became attached to this night. All Hallows is better known to modern Christians as All Saints Day. All Saints' and All Souls' Days today, like All Hallows, celebrate God's own gathering of people of every age, culture and walk of life into heaven. It is a time of glorious rejoicing.

The saints we remember are both those who enjoy the formal title of Saint – such as St John the Evangelist or St Mary. But saints are also all the people who, by their joyful service, have extended the love of God to others – many of whom you will have known.

The abundance of the harvest of souls should be as joy-filled as our celebrations of the gathering of the crops.

I mentioned harvest celebrations have ancient origins, so perhaps I should mention that 'Trick or Treat' is not entirely another Americanism that has made its way across the Atlantic, but its origins are Celtic and found their way to North America with Scottish and Irish settlers.


Although the practice of 'Trick or Treating' has pagan origins, we should remember that in Christ all things are made new. So, with or without pumpkins and ghoulish costumes, we can confidently 'laugh at the devil', who has lost his ultimate power over all God's beloved children.

Let's give thanks with joy for the harvest we need to sustain our bodies, and for those who have gone before us, gathered in by God who sustains us in body and soul.



Seeing red madly in East Meon

The Primrose Piano Quartet have performed some great concerts in the West Meon Music Festival but Suzanne Stanzeleit, Andrew Fuller, John Thwaites and Dorothea Vogel also deserve praise for their curatorial knowledge and expertise in putting together a top class set of guests in a range of local venues.

Music lovers had to get in early before the Last Night of the Proms offered stiff competition so the visit of the extravagant baroque quartet Red Priest at All Saints' Church East Meon on 14th September was more of a lunchtime matinee.

Featuring an extensive toolbelt of interchangeable recorders Piers Adams switched from tiny Garklein and soprano recorders to what looked suspiciously like a section of sawn off drainpipe and could also play two recorders simultaneously. He was matched note for note, if not in range of instruments, by violinist Julia Bishop as they took a tour around the audience in a series of "Grounds" which are like Baroque rounds. Angela East swung her cello sideways, at one point, like a bass guitarist and plucked the strings as well as bowing, was Angela East. The group was completed by new boy David Wright hiding at the back on harpsichord. But as the inscription "deeds prove the man" was inscribed in latin on the lid so his cadenza on Bach's Brandenburg Concerto was outstanding.



The concert was themed as Truly, Madly Baroque and included Bach's Adagio in B flat which was used as part of the theme music for Isle of Wight born Director Anthony Minghella's 1990 film Truly, Madly Deeply starring Alan Rickman and Juliet Stevenson about the love and grief of a widow missing her cellist boyfriend. Equally themed was the Madness of the violinist Arcangello Corelli whose eyes were supposed to turn red in the fury of his performance. All I can say is Red Priest gave him (and a sellout audience in East Meon) a run for their money.

Steep 900 celebration concert: Saturday 9th November

is to launch a year of celebration for the 900th anniversary in 2025 of our beautiful church.

Beginning with a champagne reception at 7pm, we are offering a programme of wide appeal, with performers of both national and local fame. The evening's programme at 7.30pm will be hosted by Frank Gardner (of BBC News renown) and Simon Kingsley-Pallant (Head of Drama at Bedales' Dunhurst prep School).

Amongst the performers will be the widely-renowned Tippett Quartet with local composer Damian Montagu; the Bedales Jazz Band; Alexandra Peel - an outstanding solo violinist who grew up in Steep; the Steep 900 Camerata – a twenty strong choir; and actors from the Petersfield Shakespeare Festival.

This unique evening has been arranged by the Friends of Steep Church (FOSC). All proceeds will support projects to maintain and improve All Saints' church and its surroundings. Over its nine years of existence, FOSC has raised funds through membership subscriptions and running an impressive range of community events. This has enabled the Friends to make nearly a dozen project grants to the Parochial Church Council ranging from the regilding of the weathervane cockerel to the recent installation of a completely new lighting system for the church, a broadband service and the acquisition of an electronic rehearsal piano - improvements which support the church as a place of worship and enhance its role as a treasured asset for the Steep community. FOSC is actively supporting a pipeline of future projects with the PCC to which the proceeds of this concert will contribute.

To enable as many people as possible to join this initial celebration, we are grateful to Bedales for agreeing to host the event in its new Performance Space within the school. The month of August finished with 41.4mms (1.65") of rainfall. September to the 15th has had only five days without any rain and we have had 49.2mms (1.93") up to the 15th. West Meon Parish Council and Warnford Parish Meeting

A - Boards for publicising events

WMPC reminds parishioners that they should not be displaying A - Boards on the land at the post box or by Pheasant Cottage as this land belongs to Hampshire Highways. In order to display an A - Board, parishioners will have to obtain a licence from Hampshire Highways, via application to Winchester City Council. Further details on how to obtain a licence can be found on the WMPC website. Banners for display at The Cross will still need permission from WMPC and are permitted for a maximum period of two weeks.

Lengthsman visits

The next visit by the Lengthsman will be in November. They can carry out minor works and trimming and strimming of footpaths. Please let the Clerk know if any footpaths need such work.

Traffic speed monitoring

The new flashing 30MPH signs are now installed. Although they only show the speed and not a graphic, WMPC hopes that these will be more reliable than the previous model. Currently, we are waiting for the hedges around the signs to be cut back but at least the visual reminder of the 30MPH zone has been restored.

Stagecoach bus service 67

Parishioners will know of the threat to the 67 bus service after April 2025. WMPC is continuing to lobby HCC to maintain their support for this service. Parishioners should note that a decision about the service will be announced in October this year.

Parking in West Meon

This is a complex matter and WMPC has strategic plans to increase the size of the car park by the Village Hall in the future. To try to minimise inconvenience to others, please park as considerately as possible around the village. Vehicles in the car park must be fully road legal. It helps enormously if those with more than one vehicle per household can arrange parking/ storage away from the car park and narrow roads. Vehicular access onto the Recreation Ground is prohibited other than for emergency vehicles and those that require access to carry out maintenance work or deliver/collect goods and equipment. Please contact the Clerk for details and/or to request permission.

Grants from WMPC

WMPC still has funds available for grants of up to £500. Please see the grants policy on the WMPC website or contact the Clerk.

Winter Fuel Payment

Ally Chatterley, Operations Manager at Citizens Advice Winchester District gives advice on changes to the Winter Fuel Payment, and how to access it.

"I'm a pensioner and am really worried about how I'm going to pay my energy bills this winter, especially



now the Winter Fuel Payment is only going to people on certain benefits. I don't currently receive any benefits, but my income is limited and I'm wondering if there's anything I can do."

Previously the Winter Fuel Payment, which is worth up to £300, has been given to all pensioners regardless of income. However, this winter you'll now only get the payment if you or your partner get certain benefits, including Pension Credit.

Pension Credit is one of the most underclaimed benefits there is – in Hampshire alone an estimated £2.5million of Pension Credit goes unclaimed each year. If you're of pension age and on a low income, then it's worth applying for Pension Credit even if you don't receive any other benefits.

If your application for Pension Credit is successful, then as well as receiving a monthly boost to your income, you'll also be able to access other support including making a claim for the Winter Fuel Payment.

You have until the 21st December to apply for Pension Credit and still receive the Winter Fuel Payment if successful. To find out more about the eligibility for Pension Credit and how to apply you can go to the national Citizens Advice website.
